## Building strong outreach operations



Our organization has strategically chosen Palawan as our target island region for services this 2023. Bringing a comprehensive plan to reach a total of 35 communities within 2023-2025, our efforts were initially focused on 10 communities in Brooke's Point. A subsequent expansion towards Bataraza was our next mission and we carry a long-term vision to conduct outreaches in Balabac and Mangsee Island by April 2024.

Our drive is ensuring our involvement in these communities would not be a transient occurrence but rather a continuous and dedicated effort alongside the locals. From the past, we have learned to maximize our efforts by conducting major outreach operations three times a year. We aim to deliver sustainable support and to address urgent and specific needs to uplift a community's well-being.

We emphasize that our work and intentions are not in competition with the local government but instead, we endeavor to honor and collaborate with local authorities, forging a cooperative partnership that aligns with our common desire to improve the quality of life and foster development. By combining our resources, expertise, and dedication, we can effectively work together towards this shared goal.

Ultimately, we all dream to establish enduring and mutually beneficial partnerships that contribute to the overall progress of these targeted communities. Through sustainable efforts, we aspire to bring hope and facilitate long-term positive transformation.
